#### 1. What is the purpose of the study?

We have been researching historic flooding and drought in Staffordshire with a volunteer research group in the Staffordshire Record Office. As there have not been many academic studies of volunteer projects in archive services, we are conducting a survey to find out more about the volunteers who work with the Staffordshire Record Office, including the reasons why people choose to volunteer.

#### 2. Why have I been chosen to take part?

This survey is open to anyone who has volunteered with the Staffordshire Record Office within the last two years, provided you are over the age of 16.

If you volunteer for more than one project with the SRO, please only complete the survey once.

#### 3. Do I have to take part?

Participation in this questionnaire is voluntary.

#### 4. What will happen if I take part?

If you decide to take part, you will be asked to fill in a short paper questionnaire. Questionnaires will be conducted in English. It should take approximately 10-15 minutes to complete. During the questionnaire you will asked to indicate your responses using the mechanism clearly outlined. This will usually involve selecting a response that best represents your opinion in relation to the question.

#### 5. Will I be offered any financial incentives to take part in the research?

I am not able to offer any payment or expenses for completing the questionnaire.

#### 6. Are there any risks in taking part?

There are no anticipated risks to you taking part in this questionnaire.

#### 7. Are there any benefits in taking part?

There are no direct benefits to you taking part in the research, although you will be helping me to find out information that is important to my research aims.

#### 8. What if I am unhappy or if there is a problem?

#### 9. Will my participation be kept confidential?

The questionnaire does not ask you to provide data that I think will make you identifiable. For example, I do not need to know your name, address or date of birth. I will store questionnaire data securely and provide access only to those individuals named on this information sheet. Paper questionnaires will remain the responsibility of the researcher who will ensure no-one else has access to them]. The will be kept for up to 5 years, when it will be disposed of securely. This is in accordance with the University's data archiving procedures.

#### 10. What will happen to the results of the study?

The results of this study will be used to write a research report and may lead to academic publication. A report on the results will be shared with staff at the Staffordshire Record Office and may inform their own activities.

#### 11. What will happen if I want to stop taking part?

If you begin to complete the questionnaire and do not wish to continue, you may withdraw from the study by indicating that wish you for me to dispose of your questionnaire securely. You do not have to give a reason as to why you wish to stop. As the questionnaire does not collect any data that will identify you personally, once you submit your questionnaire, your responses will not be identifiable and withdrawal will no longer be possible.


